Sri Lanka: The Commission For Truth, Unity and Reconciliation: A Damp Squib for Human Rights Archives and Records. A number of civil society organisations and various collectives responded to these announcements, issuing statements on the futility of establishing another commission, its inadequacy in terms of meeting the
